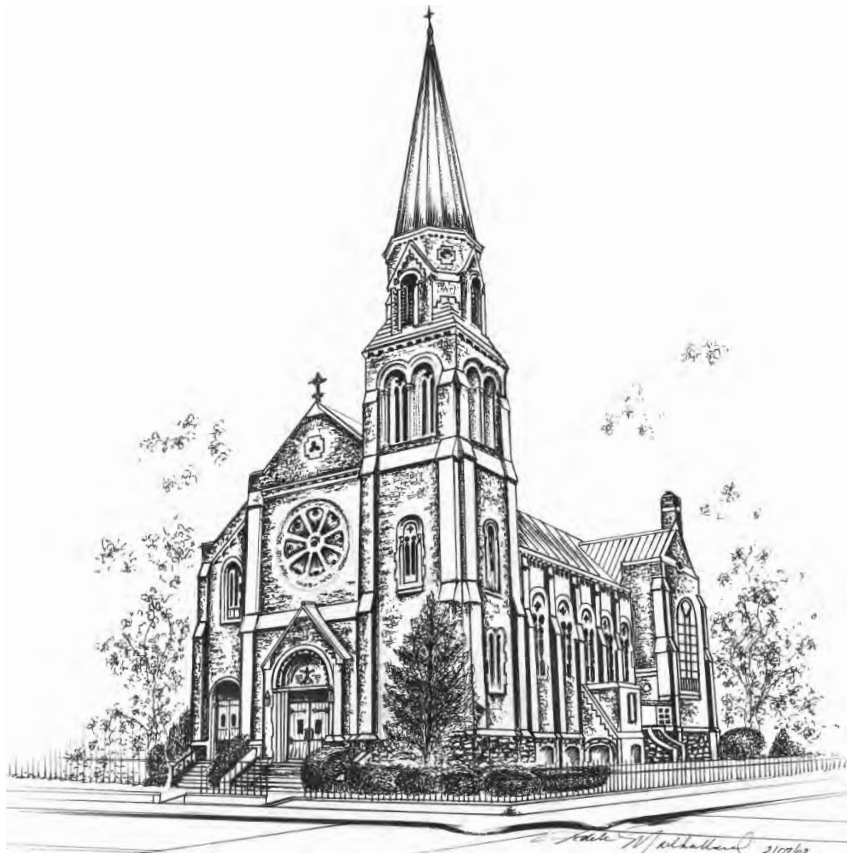

## Dear Padre

### Can people with celiac disease take substitutes for the wheat host?

This is becoming an increasingly important pastoral issue. In some cases, food allergies are so toxic that even a bit of the allergen can lead to death.

Attention was drawn to this issue when a bishop refused a mother's request to allow her child to receive first Communion with a wafer made from rice. The bishop suggested the child receive Communion only from the cup. Not satisfied by this recommendation, the entire family joined a Christian denomination that allowed the use of rice wafers.

The Vatican has decreed that there must be at least some gluten to make the host valid bread for Communion and that men who have celiac disease shouldn't be admitted to the priesthood because the priest must be able to eat and drink the Body and Blood of Christ.

So how much is some gluten? The Vatican was not specific. A group of US Benedictine nuns took on the challenge of making a wheat host that would contain .01 percent gluten. Their recipe was approved by the Vatican in July 2003. Since that approval, the nuns have been amazed at the number of requests they receive for these low-gluten wafers.

Low-gluten hosts are usually purchased by the parish and consecrated at the same time as the gluten hosts, with the low-gluten hosts placed in a separate container. Communicants who can't tolerate even the low-gluten hosts may choose to share only in the cup of Communion.

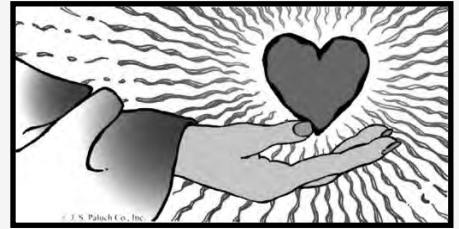

Paul’s back! After last week’s “violent abuse,” opponents organized a lynch mob that beat Paul nearly to death. But call Paul the “energizing evangelist,” transforming deadly cruelty into life-giving zeal. Paul’s past courage should inspire our commitment; Revelation’s future “new heaven, new earth” should inspire our optimism. But Revelation’s present assurance, “Behold, God’s dwelling is with the human race,” should challenge us to become “missionaries of mercy.” Because Pope Francis declared that the Church’s credibility is completely dependent on our showing unconditional mercy. Mercy, said Francis, makes the Church, the world, and everyone young again, reawakened to life’s noblest virtues. Fittingly, in today’s Gospel Jesus reinforces that theme: “This is how all will know you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

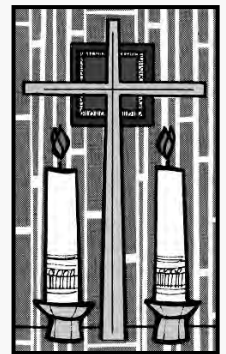


### **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Frequent fliers today have many ways to accrue air miles, so one doesn’t always have to endure long hours in cramped seats to earn free hours in cramped seats. In St. Paul’s day, there were no such perks, nor would there have been any legal system for him to protest the shipwrecks he endured. He had other rewards in mind. The churches that he established in the catalogue of cities from today’s first reading must have been very different from one another. Language, culture, customs, religious history, obstacles to community, social challenges, the places where they met, their clothing, their bread and wine, all distinct, particular to the area.

There were social customs as well: in a Christian household, the only place where a slave would be able to stand legally as an equal with the master would be at the table of the Lord, because at that table a new world of reconciliation was imaged. While Paul revered local customs, he was relentless about challenging the ways that people lived their Christian lives and how their worship reflected them. It is much the same today, as a global Catholic Church seeks to respect local customs and culture, allowing for differences in many things, yet always giving expression to the underlying presence of Christ, who binds us all together into his body.

„Oto przybytek Boga z ludźmi „,  
(Ap 21,3)

**„Księża Biskupi proszą o czytanie Pisma Świętego, bo jest to słowo Boże, w którym znajdujemy odpowiedzi na wiele naszych pytań i dylematów” – powiedział ks. Paweł Rytel Andrianik, rzecznik Konferencji Episkopatu Polski, z okazji obchodzonego w niedzielę 5 maja III Narodowego Dnia Czytania Pisma Świętego i rozpoczynającego się XI Ogólnopolskiego Tygodnia Biblijnego.**

„Pismo Święte nie może być porównane z żadną inną księgą, dlatego, że jest to słowo pisane pod natchnieniem Ducha Świętego. Podczas Mszy Świętej słyszymy na zakończenie czytań biblijnych: „Oto Słowo Boże” ponieważ przez Pismo Święte mówi do nas Bóg” – podkreśla ks. Rytel-Andrianik. Rzecznik Episkopatu zaznacza, że Pismo Święte jest bardzo aktualne, gdyż mówi nie tylko o tym co było kiedyś, ale „jest lustrem, w którym się przeglądamy i widzimy tam siebie, nasze dylematy, pytania. Tam znajdujemy na nie odpowiedź”.

„Ktoś kiedyś spytał, jakie jest najlepsze Pismo Święte? Najlepsze Pismo Święte jest to, które jest najczęściej czytane. Dobrym zaś miejscem w domu dla Pisma Świętego jest stolik przy fotelu, półka w kuchni, czy stolik przy łóżku. Wszystko po to, byśmy mieli Słowo Boże pod ręką. ### **Saint Rita of Cascia**

#### **Saint of the Day for May 22**

Like Elizabeth Ann Seton, Rita of Cascia was a wife, mother, widow, and member of a religious community. Her holiness was reflected in each phase of her life.

Born at Roccaporena in central Italy, Rita wanted to become a nun but was pressured at a young age into marrying a harsh and cruel man. During her 18-year marriage, she bore and raised two sons. After her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons had died, Rita tried to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Unsuccessful at first because she was a widow, Rita eventually succeeded.

Over the years, her austerity, prayerfulness, and charity became legendary. When she developed wounds on her forehead, people quickly associated them with the wounds from Christ's crown of thorns. She meditated frequently on Christ's passion. Her care for the sick nuns was especially loving. She also counseled lay people who came to her monastery.

Beatified in 1626, Rita was not canonized until 1900. She has acquired the reputation, together with Saint Jude, as a saint of impossible cases. Many people visit her tomb each year.

Although we can easily imagine an ideal world in which to live out our baptismal vocation, such a world does not exist. An "If only ...." approach to holiness never quite gets underway, never produces the fruit that God has a right to expect.

Rita became holy because she made choices that reflected her baptism and her growth as a disciple of Jesus. Her overarching, lifelong choice was to cooperate generously with God's grace, but many small choices were needed to make that happen. Few of those choices were made in ideal circumstances—not even when Rita became an Augustinian nun.

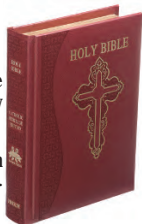
