

Dear Padre July 28, 2024

Is there really an unforgivable sin?

In the Gospels, Jesus teaches that blasphemy against the Spirit will not be forgiven (Matthew 12:31–32, Mark 3:28–29, Luke 12:10). This seems to imply the existence of a sin that God either cannot or will not forgive. Yet we have the overwhelming testimony of the Scriptures and Church teaching that God's mercy and forgiveness are more powerful than any sin, no matter how serious or frequent it might be. This apparent contradiction disappears when we carefully consider the context of Jesus' teaching on the "unforgivable sin."

Jesus' statements regarding blasphemy against the Holy Spirit occurred as part of his ongoing dispute with the scribes and Pharisees who witnessed Jesus' exorcisms but attributed them to the power of Satan, thus denying the evidence of the Spirit's saving action in Jesus' work and teaching (Matthew 12:22–32). This denial is not simply a misunderstanding. Rather, it is willful, malicious, deliberate, and unrepentant. For such people, there can truly be no forgiveness, not because God is unwilling or unable to forgive, but because the people will not recognize their need for forgiveness.

The "unforgivable sin" is not an action so horrible that even God's patience and mercy are exhausted. Rather, it is the attitude of people who reject the Lord's presence in their lives. God's offer of forgiveness is still universal. We need only respond to his grace and seek his forgiveness. ●

Jak wiecie, zbliżamy się do zakończenia tegorocznych wizyt dekanalnych. Monsignor Joseph Grimaldi, wasz lokalny Wikariusz Regionalny i ja wysłuchaliśmy waszych sugestii i obaw, a rozmowy te były dla mnie osobiście bardzo zachęcające.

W związku z nadchodzącym nowym rokiem duszpasterskim, zobowiązuję się do wdrożenia naszego Procesu Rekonfiguracji, składającego się z trzech różnych etapów w całej naszej diecezji, aby skutecznie wykorzystać nasze zasoby finansowe i personalne duchowieństwa. Celem Procesu Rekonfiguracji jest wzmocnienie relacji, które już istnieją między wspólnotami parafialnymi w poszczególnych obszarach naszej diecezji, oraz wzmocnienie różnorodnych posług, które każda parafia oferuje, współpracując, partnerując lub łącząc się z inną parafią.

Współpraca, partnerstwa lub fuzje parafii odbywają się w wielu diecezjach, a wiele parafii dzieli swojego proboszcza przynajmniej z jedną inną parafią, a liczba ta rośnie. Problemy, z którymi się tutaj spotykamy, choć na swój sposób unikalne, są podobne do tych, które występują w całym kraju. Jesteśmy jedną rodziną w wierze. Mając to na uwadze, proboszczowie w każdym dekanacie zostali zobowiązani do omówienia i dostosowania swoich harmonogramów Mszy Świętych we współpracy z innymi parafiami w swoim dekanacie tej jesieni. Zachęca się również do współpracy z sąsiednimi parafiami poza przydzielonym dekanatem, jeśli jest to duszpastersko konieczne. W związku z tym proszę, aby nie przyjmować intencji mszalnych po 30 czerwca 2025 roku.

Niezbędne jest, aby każda parafia podzielała to zobowiązanie.

W nadchodzących miesiącach usłyszycie więcej o tym procesie i zachęcam was do aktywnego udziału w konsultacjach na poziomie dekanatu. Proszę, abyście przekazywali swoje myśli i pomysły swojemu Dziekanowi. Jest to ważny moment dla nowych możliwości w naszej diecezji. Ważne jest, aby ten proces był zakorzeniony w modlitwie i otwarty na prowadzenie Ducha Świętego. Proszę, abyście byli wierni cierpliwemu rozeznawaniu i zaangażowani w tworzenie planu z waszymi liderami parafialnymi, Dziekanem i Wikariuszem Regionalnym, który wyznaczy mapę drogową dla przyszłej żywotności i żywiołowości wszystkich naszych parafii w Brooklynie i Queens.

Dziękuję za współpracę, gdy wkraczamy w tę nową fazę rekonfiguracji w naszej diecezji. Zapewniam was o moich stałych modlitwach za każdego z was i za wspólnoty parafialne.

Dear Pastors and Administrators,

As you know we are coming up on the conclusion of this year's Deanery visits. Monsignor Joseph Grimaldi, your local Regional Episcopal Vicar and I have listened to your suggestions and concerns, and the conversations have personally been very encouraging to me.

As we look to the new pastoral year, I am committed to implement our Reconfiguration Process, with its three different stages throughout our diocese, in order to effectively utilize our financial and clergy personnel resources. The purpose of the Reconfiguration Process is to strengthen the relationship that already exists among parish communities in particular areas of our diocese and to enhance the varied ministries that each parish offers, while collaborating, partnering or merging with another parish.

Collaboration, partnerships, or parish mergers are taking place in many dioceses and a number of parishes share their pastor with at least one other parish with that number growing. The issues we face here in our diocese, though unique in their own ways, are similar to what is happening throughout the country. We are one family in faith.

With this in mind, pastors in each deanery have been tasked to discuss and adjust their Mass schedules in collaboration with the other parishes in their deanery this coming Fall. You are also strongly encouraged to work with neighboring parishes outside your assigned deanery, if pastorally necessary. To that effect, I am asking that no Mass intentions be taken after June 30, 2025. It is essential that every parish share in this commitment.

You will hear more about this process in the coming months, and you are encouraged to engage actively in the consultation opportunities at the deanery level. Please provide your thoughts and ideas to your Dean. This is an important moment for new opportunities in our diocese. It is crucial that this process be rooted in prayer and open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. I ask that you be faithful to patient discernment and committed to creating a plan with your Parish Leadership, Dean and Regional Vicar that will set the roadmap for the future vitality and vibrancy of all our parishes in Brooklyn and Queens.

Thank you for your cooperation as we embark in this new phase of reconfiguration in our diocese. Be assured of my continued prayers for each of you and parish communities.
